In order to carry out the wishes of the College as regards uniformity in Dress, each Chorister is required to bring with him the following articles :

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| 8 White Shirts, <i>or</i> | 3 Pairs of Boots or Shoes. |
| 4 Flannel Shirts. | 1 Pair of black Slippers. |
| 3 Night Shirts. | 1 Great Coat (black). |
| 3 Under Waistcoats. | 2 High Hats. |
| 3 Pairs of Drawers (if worn). | 1 White Flannel Cricketing Suit. |
| 6 Pairs of Dark Socks. | 3 Black Neckties. |
| 16 Eton Collars. | 2 Hair Brushes and Combs. |
| 12 White Pocket Handkerchiefs. | Nail, Tooth and Clothes |
| 2 Eton Suits (Black Trowsers). | Brushes. |
| 1 Dark Tweed Suit. | 1 Sponge. |

The College will supply Surplice and Gown.

The Cricketing Straw can be obtained at Cambridge.

If white shirts are sent, the neckties should be sailor-knots; but if the shirts are of flannel, the waistcoat and necktie should be so arranged as to conceal the shirt.

Every article sent with a Boy must be plainly marked, and a complete List should be forwarded whenever he returns to School.

The Choristers are required to be well dressed at all times. It is therefore essential that the clothing be sent in good condition. By order of the College all deficiencies are to be made good at Cambridge, and the bills will be sent to the Parents.

It is also expressly required by the College that no Boy who, during the holidays, has been in any way exposed to infectious illness shall be sent back to School till after due notice of the fact has been sent, and permission to return obtained from the College authorities, so that proper precautions may be taken.
